Well, I want to tell you something and I also want to share a story today that'll let you know that, you know what? You're going to run into this, but the truth is this. You don't need everyone. We're often told that we need to have a million followers before we can make money on the internet. Or we need to have a ton of people who are interested in what we're doing before it's really worth saying or if we are building a business or starting a mommy group or whatever we're doing, it doesn't really count if we don't have the validation of a bunch of people who give me a resounding yes.

I need you to be prepared to understand that you can do anything in this world with the right tools and the right resources. And thanks to the information age, that stuff is all around you. You can do it. But you need to work on your mindset because if you aren't prepared for how people will respond to you when you start to change, when you step into your God given calling, when you decide that you are worthy of more and you decide to be more. Well, you're constantly going to be running in circles and never actually accomplishing what's meant for you. Because here's the truth, when you start to change, when you start leaning into what your calling is, when you start desiring and wanting for more and making the steps towards it, you will run into people around you who will have a problem with it.

Now, what does that problem manifest as? Well, it can manifest as just negativity. It can manifest as what looks like support, but really they're tearing you down everywhere you go. It can manifest as being unavailable and not being positive. It can manifest as tearing down your ideas even though you know they're rock solid. To quote the famed DJ Khaled, and for those you guys who aren't familiar, he is both a rapper and a brilliant philosopher. He says, they don't want to see you win, they don't want to see you grow. And the truth is some people don't want to see you win and they don't want to see you grow and it tears you up inside. You know that you're meant for good in this world and you know that the thing you want to do is really just about impact and change. It's not about the money.

Entrepreneurship is hard. Being a mom is hard. Being a good wife is hard to do. It requires you to change and be more than yourself. To step out of yourself, to be selfless, to sacrifice. It is hard. Why is that? What do I need to change? Well, some people step into that. Some people like us, like our friendship, we challenge each other, we inspire each other. We force each other to grow and be more. But we all know that person in our midst who is not that person who instead of stepping up to the challenge around them, instead pushes back and says, this can't be real. Because if I can unpack your success, if I can say that your success is due to other circumstances unrelated to mine. Oh, she's always been pretty. Oh, she's always been smart. Oh, she got this deal. Oh, she had this promotion. Oh, she had this money. If I can unpack her success with excuses then I am not forced to grow and be better within myself. And you know what? It's a shame for them, but it does not have to derail you.

Let me tell you a story. So when I first started deciding that I wanted to pivot a way from the world of corporate and into the world that I knew God had for me, and I knew that I had something more to offer this world. Well, I was blessed to be in a community of amazing bloggers. That's right. That's where I started. I started off as a blogger. I built this amazing blogger community. I saw support and guess what? I was making money doing it because you know I don't do free. So brands were working with me. Well my fellow blogger peers, they were rallying around me. I had amazing support. These were some of my very first clients. And these bloggers were so amazed by the fact that I was able to generate real income while working my nine to five job and living out, at the time, my passion and my story. And it was from someone that I thought was a dear friend of mine, someone that not long before had asked me and said, Hey Nicole, can you help support me?

Someone that I'd sat down with and spent time with, helping them unpack their business and support them, and this person came up who had posted online. Oh yeah. I don't really know about her numbers. I mean I have more followers then her and I'm not making that type of money. It can't be the real deal. I was gobsmacked. I couldn't believe it. I was shocked. One, by the fact that someone would say something that was clearly an untruth and two, by somebody that I thought supported me. That someone that I thought was universally pretty positive. Whenever you see change happening and you don't understand why, and it makes you confront your own truth, well, you act out in certain ways. Well, here's what happened next. I picked up my phone and I called her because that's what I'd always learned, right? If you have a problem with someone or someone hurts you, you give them the benefit of the doubt and you pick up the phone to find out more. You let them know you've been hurt and then you find out what their intent was. Well, let's just say that call didn't go as I expected. I actually had to step out into the front portion just to get some air.

I remember when they answered, they were like, oh hi. It was almost as if nothing had ever happened. I thought that was a little weird. But then I said, hey, so I saw this thing online and I don't quite understand why it happened because you know me. You know our business, you know what I've done and heck you even asked me to work with you to help you build yours. Why would you say something like this? To which she responded, listen, I don't really know what you're doing or what you're not doing. But all I know is that you talking about money and how much you're making, this business you're building, well, it makes me really uncomfortable. And I know that I've been doing this for a while and I'm not seeing numbers like you're seeing and if I'm not seeing it, I don't know if I believe you. And if you keep up like this, and guys, this was maybe three years ago. If you keep up like this, you'll never make it.

It'll all catch up with you and it'll all come crashing down. And I just want to let you know that now's a good time to turn it around before people start really talking about you. I was completely silent. All I remember is the wind whipping across my face as hot tears rolled down and met at my chin. I was so heartbroken. And the reality was less by the words that she was saying, but more by the fact that someone close to me could see that I was changing and growing and seeing positive results in my life and not being supportive of it. I couldn't believe it, but here's the deal. I chose to take the high road. I said to her, I appreciate what you've said. Thank you so

much for your feedback. That's not my truth. I work hard at what I do and I am honest and working with integrity.

However, I wish you the best. And I got off the phone and I went back inside and I collapsed into my husband's arms in tears. She'd actually hit on a point for me. My imposter syndrome. Imposter Syndrome tells you that you aren't deserving of the things that you've worked for. And she kind of tapped a nerve there and sometimes that's how the enemy works, right? God, girls, you hear me on this? Sometimes people come for the thing that you know is your Achilles heal, the thing that's going to hurt you most, especially when what you're doing is leaning you towards God and drawing you closer to glorifying Him. And for me that was a sore spot. I remember leaning into my husband and saying, why would someone say this about me? You know how hard I work, you know the results I'm getting. Why would they say this and this person?

I mean I just don't understand it. And my husband looked at me in the face and he said, Nicole, do you like who you are? Do you like who you've become? Do you like how you are showing up in this world? And I paused and I just thought about it for a second. I said, yeah, I really do. I couldn't be happier. And then he said to me, well, if you like it, I love it and if it ain't broke, don't fix it. Remember, you don't need everyone. If there's nothing else you take from our time together, just remember that you don't need to waste your time trying to sell everyone on your idea.
